She says the club has the money to do the work, but it will likely not begin until spring July 2 - 16, 2020

Residential day cares considered

A zoning change that would allow residential daycare centres in the community has been given first two readings by Council. Next steps would include an opportunity for public input.

The District's Emily Kaehn said that day care has been identified as an issue in the community and as an important factor in workforce attraction.

Mackenzie to receive \$500,000 toward trail, outdoor rec facilties

Mackenzie is one of over The community grants from 150 recipients of provincial grants supporting economic development and recreational opportunities in rural communities, announced by the province in June.

The District of Mackenzie will receive \$500,000 toward what it is calling the "Destination Trail & Facilities Project." This has been described as trail and infrastructure upgrades that will link the recreation centre, ski hill, bike park, beach park, and x-country ski trails, and will allow for vear-round use.

CNC Research Forest also announced earlier this year funding to the District for a community bike/walk "connector" trail that will offer accessible and low-impact recreation. The District has so far not commented on whether this is the same project, and when work will begin.

No borrowing for new firehall

The District announced in May that a second "installment" of a large provincial grant received last year can be used instead of borrowing for construction of the new fire

The bulk of the \$4.7 million Northern Capital and Planning Grant received last year was allocated for the new hall, budgeted at \$6.5 million, with \$2.12 million to be borrowed, starting this fall. Instead, Finance has said that a second disbursement of the same grant will cover the amount that was to be borrowed, while also leaving \$336,000 for other projects.

Mayor chafes at notices left on post office floor

In a general news update broadcast on CHMM, Mayor Joan Atkinson expressed disappointment at the number of District notices that typically get discarded on the Post Office floor.

She said the notices are, in part, a response to complaints about poor District communication and are there to help inform residents. The mayor's news update, incidentally, was not shared with The Buzzette.


Out of the box came an airplane. It flew 10,000 feet high with me in it. Then an alien shot us down. That is when I flew out of the plane and found that I could fly.

Mackenzie rally: fighting for forestry jobs

From an article on the June 23rd rally in Mackenzie on mill closures. By Peter Ewart and Dawn Hemingway, for PG Daily News.

...What has been especially disturbing to residents is that Canfor, still holding onto timber rights, has been selling off logs and allowing thousands of truckloads of timber to be shipped out to other jurisdictions while keeping its own mill in Mackenzie shuttered indefinitely.

Chris Dixon, president of Unifor Local 1092, noted how important appurtenancy had been to the development of the town... and called upon the current provincial government to stop "playing the blame game." Canfor is "killing the town," he said, and must stop "selling off our jobs and our logs.

Joan Atkinson, Mayor of Mackenzie... explained how several decades back. the forest industry in Mackenzie had been a model for full log utilization, from cruising and layout in the bush, to harvesting operations, to processing at the sawmills, to delivering residuals to the pulp mill and co-generation plant.

However, in July 2019, Canfor broke that utilization chain.

"By walking away from this community and their chip agreement with Paper Excellence," Atkinson said, "Canfor has demonstrated that social license and support for local communities is not part of their mandate."

She noted that currently "the forest industry is under the control of a few large companies," and that changes in legislation must be made "to return control of the industry to the people of British Colum-With a provincial bia." election coming up in 2021, she said, this must be made an election issue.
