

#### ER closures an ongoing concern

Mackenzie & District Hospital has been on diversion three days in a row this month, for 12-hour periods from October 4th through 7h, at time of writing. The temporary closures mean emergency care patients are diverted to the nearest available hospital outside of the community, usually Prince George. The closures are due to a nursing shortage.

Extra provincial funding has been announced to help with nurse recruitment and training in the north, including a Northern Baccalaureate Nursing Program in Fort St. John through UNBC.

#### Gym user angry over vax proof muddle

Confusion about an age limit in the province's proof of vaccination order implemented last month led to a breach of the order at the Rec Centre fitness room.

Regular gym user Jeff Hunt said the Rec Centre allowed unvaccinated patrons under the age of 21 into the gym, creating risk for himself and other users.

The provincial order exempts youth sports from proof of vaccination but not gym users. Rec Director Terry Gilmer said Rec staff corrected the error and the new restrictions now apply.

Hunt said the uncertainty of exposure in the intervening days caused him to lose visiting time with his mom in the hospital for over a



Proposed Amendment to the Mt. Milligan Copper-Gold Mine Environmental Assessment Certificate

#### **Invitation to Comment**

On March 16, 2009, an Environmental Assessment Certificate (# M09-01) was issued for the Mt. Milligan Copper-Gold Project located approximately 92 kilometers north of Fort St. James and 95 kilometers west of Mackenzie. Thompson Creek Metals Company Inc. (Certificate Holder) is proposing to use surface water withdrawals for operation of the mine for the life of the project and modify the approved project design by not constructing the Meadows Creek Water Supply Pond as planned.

The Certificate Holder must amend their existing environmental assessment certificate before any work can be undertaken related to the proposed amendment. An amendment application (Application) for this proposal was submitted on August 17, 2021 and is subject to review under British Columbia's Environmental Assessment Act. EAO invites comments on this Application.

All comments received during this comment period in relation to the Amendment Application will be considered.

The intention of seeking public comments is to ensure that all potential effects -

environmental, economic, social, heritage and health – that might result from the proposed amendment are identified for consideration as part of the assessment

A comment period on the Application for an Environmental Assessment Certificate will be open for 30 days from October 15, 2021 to November 14, 2021 at midnight PDT.

#### Fun Coffee history

Not everyone loved coffee when it was first introduced in Europe. In the late 1700s, a decree by the Bishop of Münster declared:

"The misuse of the coffee beverage has become so extended that to counteract the evil we command that... no one shall sell coffee, roasted or not roasted, under a fine of one hundred dollars, or two years in prison, for each offense.'

"Every coffee-roasting and coffee-serving place shall be closed, and dealers and hotelkeepers are to get rid of their coffee supplies in four weeks."

"It is only permitted to obtain from the outside coffee for one's own consumption, in lots of fifty pounds. Housefathers and mothers shall not allow their work people, especially their washing and ironing women, to prepare coffee, or to allow it in any manner, under a penalty of one hundred dollars..."
