Bylaw fines beef up

Council gave first three readings to an
amended Municipal Ticketing bylaw that
will see some heftier fines for our commu-
nity transgressions.

Mentioned above in this issue are some
new fines for off-leash dogs and poop
scooping failures. The keeping of exotic
animals anywhere in the District can now
also garner a \$1000 fine.

The fine for being in a park after 11 p.m.
is now \$80, up from \$50, and you can be
fined \$100 for possessing liquor in a park
at any time. Smoking or vaping in a pro-
hibited area carries a \$100 penalty.

Other proposed ticketing and fines
changes include noise control, prohibited
parking, hazardous waste in
garbage, and violating water
use (sprinkling) restrictions.

"No room at the inn" for beetles

Mackenzie Forest District
(FLNRO) will be testing
out spruce beetle repellent
on some local trails this
spring to protect high-risk
spruce stands.

Vulnerable trees along
Deet Trail and the south
end of Morfee Lake Trail
will receive MCH pods,
which carry a pheromone
that signals to incoming
beetles that the tree is
already overpopulated, so
they move on.

Stewardship Forester
Elliot Wiechula said the
pods, which are non -toxic
and will be placed higher
up the tree, will go up
before the beetles begin to
fly.

Wiechula added, "The
beetle flies like clockwork
when it hits 16 degrees in
the forest."
