In November 2022, Mackenzie RCMP responded to 185 files. Mackenzie RCMP noted a high volume of false alarms (27) due to windstorms and powe outages. Mackenzie RCMP responded to an above average amount of motor vehicle incidents (19) and mental health files (9) believed to be linked to illegal substance use.

Investigations of Interest:

A proposed rebranding and renaming plan for School District 57 was put on the backburner by a 4 - 3 vote of trustees this week. The vote, motioned by Mackenzie trustee Rachael Weber, nixes the plan before a public survey on the topic has even closed.

Trustees against the plan cited more pressing financial priorities for the district.

Iris Energy "weathering the storm"

Beset by low Bitcoin prices and the loss of some of its mining hardware due to a loan default in November, Iris Energy said it is "weathering the storm" in its most recent corporate update.

Its Mackenzie facility on Coquiwalldie Road has been expanded from 50 MW to 80 MW "ahead of schedule" according to the update, with the infrastructure "energized" on December 6th, ahead of operations.

The company's daily operating "hashrate (processing computations) was 1,445 in November, after a high of 3,899 in

RGMP Report...

Mackenzie Airport It was noted multiple items were stolen including quads. At this time some of the property had been located/returned and RCMP are actively working to identify suspects.

- On 2022-11-04 Mackenzie RCMP received a report of a domestic assault. Police arrested the accused for 3 counts of assault and breach of court ordered conditions. A bail hearing was completed and the accused was remanded to Prince George correctional centre. The accused was released on 2022-11-10 and is to appear in Mackenzie court 2022-12-15.
- On 2022-11-07 Mackenzie RCMP responded to a report of a fatal motor vehicle accident. Investigation completed and no charges for surviving driver. Media release completed at time for file. BC coroner's services has taken the file.
- On 2022-11-10 Mackenzie RCMP responded to a report of a suspicious persons on a quad. RCMP attended and confirmed the quad to be stolen. Two people well-known to police were arrested and are to appear in court in Mackenzie on 2023-02-09
- On 2022-11-20 Mackenzie RCMP assisted Mackenzie fire

and rescue and BC Ambulance with a motor vehicle collision on Hwy 39 in Mackenzie. Police arrived and confirmed the driver to be impaired by alcohol via an approved screening device. 90-day suspension issues and vehicle was impounded for 30 days.

- On 2022-11-21 Mackenzie RCMP responded to a report of a motor vehicle incident in McLeod Lake. Police arrived and located the driver. The driver was brought back to the detachment where they provided samples of their breath confirming they were over double the legal limit to be driving. RCMP are completing the investigation at this time and will be forwarding charges of impaired operation of a motor vehicle
- On 2022-11-24 Mackenzie RCMP responded to a report of a person breaching a no contact court order condition. Police spoke to all parties and are completing a court package requesting a warrant for the accused.
- On 2022-11-29 Mackenzie RCMP responded to an unresponsive male in the industrial area. Police attended and confirmed the person to be deceased. Investigation revealed nothing suspicious and the BC coroners service has taken the file.


Chetwynd cadets got to stay overnight for the duration of the program.

Accessibility on the radar

Five community members were selected through an application process this month to form a new District committee overseeing accessibility issues in town.

New B.C. legislation requires municipalities to develop an accessibility and age-friendly plan and to build a tool to receive feedback on accessibility in the community.

Asked if the five-member committee is representative of the community, Council liaison Raye McMeeken said it includes two seniors, two service providers and one person with lived experience of accessibility issues.

A previous, 11-member committee was dissolved by Council in 2020, with CNC's New Horizons program assuming some of those functions
