Brewery + lounge idea okayed

A non-descript storefront sandwiched between Kelly's Bakery and Northern Star Automotive could come to life as a "brew lounge" at some point in the near future as Council last week approved in principle an application to the provincial Liquor Control Board by MackChu Brewing Ltd. for a brew lounge to operate there. The lounge would have potential seating for 24.

Metals, gems abound here says local miner

Rocks, minerals and mining were the topic at a talk given by longtime resident and miner Dave Forshaw and regional geologist Hasan Heidarian on Sunday. The event was hosted at Mackenzie Community Services as part of their monthly "How do I..." speaker series.

Forshaw gave some anecdotal mining history of the area including the origins of a family claim across the lake that was worked with pick and shovel and produced 67 ounces of gold in one vear.

He said he's also found corundum, which is No. 2 in hardness after diamonds, as well as emeralds, rubies, and pyroclastic garnets, which can be indicators for diamond deposits.

Heidarian gave a rundown of current projects and exploration in northern B.C., and how to look up claims on the provincial interactive map.

The next "How do I..." talk will be the third Sunday in November.

'Off-leash dogs'...

change to the Animal Control Bylaw in 2022 designated all trails in the community as offleash for dogs unless counterindicated by signage. The amendment, described by District staff as merely "housekeeping" was approved by Mayor and Council.

Former Public Works Manager Brennan MacArthur confirmed to The Buzzette in 2022 that the change had been made but that the District website had not yet been updated to reflect it. He did not respond to the query that off-leash dogs could impact trail use by

As of this month, the District website still says dogs must be leashed on trails.

Did you know? Ride and Tie

In pre-automotive days "Ride and Tie" meant one person rode ahead by horse while the other walked. When the rider had gone two miles, he or she would stop, tie the horse to a tree and continue forward on foot.

When the person behind reached the horse, he would untie and ride for the next two miles. In this way, two people and one horse could cover ten miles with each person only walking five miles each (and the horse getting a break every two miles).

Prospecting parties during the Gold Rush often traveled this way.


