PG: Driest year since 1918

Despite a wetter than normal December, Prince George experienced its driest year on record since 1918 with a total of 342.3 mm of precipitation recorded at the airport for 2023, much less than the more typical 594 mm annually, according to the Prince George Citizen. The region was at drought level 4 at the end of November.

Mackenzie and region were at drought level 3 as of November 30, and the Peace region at drought

Where are the **RCMP** reports?

Mackenzie RCMP's monthly Mayor's Report will no longer include Investigations of Interest, a list of incidents the detachment responded to each month, excerpts of which were published in The Buzzette every month as well.

Responding to a council query, new Detachment Commander Chris Bezaire told the Committee of the Whole this week that the inclusion of detailed incident information in the Mayor's Reports was "over-reporting" and is not typically part of the monthly report to a local council. He said some incident details have to be treated as protected information.

Monthly RCMP reports are published in council agendas for Committee of the Whole. A quick survey by The Buzzette found that the Investigations of

Found inside a secret pocket were cryptic notes scrawled on two scrunched up papers, with one readable phrase stating: "Bismark Omit leafage buck bank / Paul Ramify loamy event false new event.

The puzzle became one of the top 50 unsolved encrypted messages until a University of Manitoba data analyst finally cracked the code.

After numerous decoding attempts, Wayne Chan deduced that the codes were a sophisticated way to telegraph condensed weather observations for stations across the United States and Canada in the year 1888. The reason? That remains a

Short-term rentals rules need updating: Council to Mackenzie, have also

In a bid to address a rising demand for short-term rentals in the community, the District is contemplating updates to its bylaws, and will present amendments to Council in the weeks to come

Current rules allow for hotels and bed-and-breakfasts but not for other kinds of rentals, such as those on platforms like Airbnb and VRBO.

A staff report says there has been an expressed need for more short-term rentals in the community. Organizers for the upcoming Community Forest Association AGM in June, an event that is expected to bring up to 250 participants

expressed concerns about a room shortage.

The report says an update to the rules could improve professional recruitment and local services by freeing up more accommodation for travel nurses and physicians, industrial workers, and encourage more conferences and sporting events.

The proposed change coincides with the Province's announcement of tighter regulations including, among other things, a principal residence requirement, and a mandate for operators to display valid business licenses.

Rare earth project generates buzz

An agreement to partner on a rare earth elements (REE) mine north of Prince George was announced last week between the McLeod Lake Indian Band (MLIB) and Defense Metals of Vancouver.

Wicheeda mine, planned as an open pit project 35 kilometres east of Bear Lake, would produce neodymium and praseodymium, metals that the company says are

used in the production of green energy and defence technologies.

Once running, the mine is projected to employ a work force of 200 full-time with a capacity to produce 25,000 tonnes of rare earth oxide, 10% of the global supply of REE, according to company statements. The raw product would initially be shipped to China for processing, according to the Prince George Citizen.





Interest write-ups were a recent addition, beginning in 2019. They did not appear in reports from earlier years, at least going back to 2008.

Bezaire also reported that Mackenzie will see fewer court dates in the coming year, with some months seeing no court dates at all, due to decisions made in the circuit court.

MLIB also announced an equity purchase of 2.6 million common shares in the company. The project agreement will see "a joint planning approach, empowering MLIB to play an integral part in the design and decision-making".

The project is still in its exploratory and planning phase.
