### Big spike for bear calls in 2023

Unsurprising perhaps to many, bear calls to Conservation more than quadrupled in our area for 2023.

According to Conservation Officer Hilary Desmarais, between Mackenzie, Mcleod Lake, and Tsay Keh there were 644 calls to the COS regarding black bears. Thirty-five bears were destroyed. This is five times the number that were destroyed in 2021 - 22, the last year for which the COS has statistics. (Mackenzie region was without a Conservation Officer in 2022-23).

In a response to *The Buzzette*, Desmarais wrote: "The destruction of a bear is not taken lightly and is only undertaken when the bear has become a risk" to community safety.



She said removing bears is also not a long-term solution: "The removal of one bear creates space for another bear and the cycle will continue until the root cause is addressed."

Desmarais praises the District's new quest for front-loading commercial garbage bins. She also offered thanks to community members for their efforts in strapping garbage cans, picking fruit trees and keeping properties free of attractants.

"Without a consistent food source, there is no reason for the bears to be in our yards...or our community."
