CNC adapts to enrolment changes

The College of New Caledonia (CNC) announced last week it is communicating with staff about its financial and enrolment situation following federal changes this year reducing international study permits by 35%.

CNC says it has seen a decline in international student enrolment and is predicting very few international students to arrive in subsequent terms.

The college says if no changes are made, it anticipates an operating deficit in the 2025 -2026 fiscal year and is planning budget reductions, including layoffs.

Programs for current international students are being maintained while the college shifts its focus to domestic enrolment.

Programs will also adjust to align with federal changes to eligible occupations for post-graduate work permits.

New Cariboo gold mine

An operating permit has been granted to Montreal-based Osisko Development Corporation, owner of Barkerville Gold Mines, for a new gold mine near Wells, B.C.

Cariboo Gold is an underground mine that will employ approximately 634 people and the capacity to process over a million tonnes per year of gold-bearing ore. According to the company profile the project covers an area of approximately 155,000 hectares.

It will include underground mining over 16 years, ore milling at the Quesnel River mine, approximately 58 kilometres southeast of Quesnel, storage of waste rock at the Bonanza Ledge Mine near Barkerville, and a transmission line from the Quesnel area to the mine.

A waste permit under the Environmental Management Act for the project is now being reviewed and a decision is expected in the coming weeks.

Ice rink re-opens

Results of Mackenzie Council's byelection were made official last week and Peter Kyllo was to be sworn in as the new member of Council this week.

Kyllo, a longtime resident who also ran in the 2022 general council election, won with 192 votes. Runner-up Cassandra Carter, who moved to Mackenzie just over two years ago, received 115 votes. A total of 446 votes were cast, representing a voter turnout of 17%.

Paper Excellence, the owners of the now shuttered Mackenzie pulp mill, is again under scrutiny by federal politicians with the news that owner Jackson Wijaya has acquired sole control of Asia Pulp & Paper from his father, according to CBC News.

The latter company has poor environmental and human rights records in Indonesia, and abandoned its U.S. operations after defaulting on \$13.9 billion USD in loans, according to other media reports.

Having acquired Domtar and Resolute Forest Products in recent years, Paper Excellence (reportedly now using the name Domtar)


