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Small plane crash near Tumbler

Mackenzie RCMP reported a downed single-engine plane last week. They had been alerted by an SOS signal transmitted over the SPOT satellite system.

The plane had been flying from Williams Lake to Fort St. John on May 21 and went down "in a remote area" between McLeod Lake and Tumbler Ridge.

RCMP Air-3 located the crash site, and the pilot – the lone occupant of the plane – was extracted by a Police Service dog.

Mackenzie Search and Rescue was among the response team, including Joint Rescue Coordination Centre. The pilot was transported to hospital.

Sergeant Chriz Bezaire told Council this week that the pilot suffered only a broken wrist. The \$400,000 plane was totalled.


