## Tooth regrowth being tested

Scientists in Japan are running the first tests on a drug that can regenerate teeth.

## Large work camp okayed by Council

Construction of a 700-person workcamp off Mill Road to house workers for Enbridge's Westcoast Gas pipeline expansion project received formal support from Council at their last meeting.

The company provided a summary from their community Open House held on July 15. Concerns from the community centered on the impacts a large temporary workforce could have on local services like groceries supply, pharmaceuticals, medical and emergency services.

Community members also wanted to see a commitment to local hiring for the project, as well as care for local wildlife and natural areas.

Responding to a query from *The Buzzette*, Councillor Jesse Wright confirmed that the question of what will happen to the camp after the project – how it will be disposed of – was also raised by Council members.

The company has previously stated that their camp structures are built to be connected and disconnected easily.

## Heat deaths in Arizona

More than 400 people are suspected to have died from extreme heat in Maricopa County, Arizona, this summer as a heatwave continues its blast through the U.S. southwest. August has seen temperatures above 110 degrees Fahrenheit, with a top temperature reached so far of 118 F (48 degrees Celsius, according to The Guardian newspaper.

Maricopa County in the Sonora Desert is home to Phoenix and Scottsdale. It has recorded annual heat deaths in the 600s over the last two years.

## Mine extension detailed at EAO

A typed notice posted last month at the Post Office was Mackenzie's only notification of a request by Centerra Gold for a permit amendment related to a change in their tailings discharge at Mt. Milligan mine.

The proposed change is one of many required in the company's application to extend the mine's operations to 2035. Public comment for that application closed in July.

Changes will include expanding the open pit mine, increasing the dam height of the tailings storage facility, and

expanding the area for groundwater withdrawal, and a host of other changes.

The proposed amendments are available on the Environmental Assessment Office's website, but the EAO did not explain the lack of notification in Mackenzie, which is considered a partner community for Mt. Milligan mine.
